

PANCHGAVYA TRAINING

Every person in this world is suffering with one or other disease. And all modern methods of treatments give rise to another disease or side effects. There is a tremendous need to provide a Holistic Health Solution to Humanity at large. A solution is being provided by Ayurveda which means A Science of Life. It not just only provides cure for diseases but guides one to keep away from them. Ayurvedic formulations contain various herbs treated with Cow urine, Cow dung ash, Milk, Butter Milk, Ghee- the byproducts of Cow. These five byproducts combined together are called as Panchgavya. BSST provided training of Panchgavya in rural areas for the farmers with new technologies and new techniques of farming to increase their productivity.

This has resulted in tremendous growth of microfinance sector in India through different approaches.









ADIP

NAME OF DEPARTMENT:- MINISTRIES OF SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT, NEW DELHI

The main objective of the Scheme is to provide grants-in-aid to the various implementing agencies (National Institutes/ Composite Regional Centres /Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India(ALIMCO)/ District Disability Rehabilitation Centres/State Handicapped Development Corporations/other local bodies/ NGOs) so that they are in a position to assist needy disabled persons in procuring durable, sophisticated and scientifically manufactured, modern, standard aids and appliances to promote physical, social and psychological rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities through reducing the effects of disabilities and at the same time enhance their economic potential.



Assistive devices are givens to Persons with Disabilities with an aim to improve their independent functioning,

and to arrest the extent of disability and occurrence of secondary disability.

The aids and appliances supplied under the Scheme must have due certification. The scheme also envisages conduct of corrective surgeries, whenever required, before providing an assistive device.



The Persons with Disabilities from rural, tribal and other interior areas come across lot of difficulties in obtaining rehabilitation services. In order to overcome these difficulties, BSST has also worked for Aids Appliance Distribution in Various District of Gujarat such as Patan, Banaskantha, Mehshana, Gandhinagar, Aanand, Sabarkantha, Kutch and Surendranagar to make them aware more about the problems and how to overcome with their interventions in their daily life.



WATER COMPAIGN

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – MARUTI CSR

Maruti Suzuki India Limited is committed to improving the basic living conditions of the communities around its facilities. Along with Waterlife India and the village panchayat, Maruti Suzuki inaugurated a Water ATM plant.

Maruti Suzuki has taken up various community development initiatives to improve the water and sanitation condition in the villages of Manesar. The Company has taken up comprehensive sanitation program which includes construction of individual household toilets and laying of sewer lines along with solid and liquid waste management. The project intends to give a human face to the police force and minimize incidents of crime in the society.









AHVY

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – MINISTRY OF TEXTLIES, NEW DELHI

The **Ambedkar Hastshilp Vikas Yojana** (AHVY) mainly targets the integrated development of the society and aimed to promote the handicrafts by creating the artisans who have the capability to manage things professionally. Handicrafts constitute an important segment of the de-centralized/unorganized sector of our economy. It is mainly rural based, having reach in backward and in-accessible area.



Originally, started as a part time activity in rural areas, it has now transformed into a flourishing economic activity due to significant market demand over the years. Handicrafts have big potential as they hold the key for sustaining not only the existing set of millions of artisans spread over length and breadth of the country, but also for increasingly large number of new entrants in the crafts activity.









APPERAL TRAINING CENTER

NAME OF DEPARTMET – COMMISSIONER UDHAYG BHAVAN, GANDHINAGAR



Apparel Training & Design Centre (ATDC) continued its pursuit of excellence in vocational education space by providing employable skills for the youth, women and disadvantaged sections of society.

The Training of Trainers' Academy at ATDC is committed to upgrade the knowledge base and skill levels of instructors and trainers within ATDC and to develop an industry oriented approach in the pedagogy, teaching and instructional methodologies.







Participatory Irrigation Management (PIM)

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – SARDAR SAROVER NARMADA NIGAM LTD. GANDHINAGAR

The concept of Participatory Irrigation Management (PIM) has been recognized all over the world as a tool for improving irrigation management along with sustainability of the system. Irrigation systems need to be restructured to make water management efficient. However increasing demand of water in all sectors including irrigation made it imperative that the efficiency of the Irrigation Water Management must be increased. National Water Policy and State Water Policy, lay emphasis on participatory irrigation management to be adopted as an essential strategy for improving the performance of all the irrigation projects and therefore farmers should be involved progressively from the grass root level particularly in water distribution &canal maintenance.









BSST has performed Participation Irrigation Management training in 6 phase in Patan Gujarat for the farmers to protect the environment and to ensure ecological balance inculcating sense of ownership of the irrigation system in accordance with the water budget and the operational plan & for Collective involvement in better application & management of agricultural extension services.







NACP-IV (MIGRANTS)

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – GUJARAT STATE AIDS CONTROL SOCITY, MEHSHANA

The National AIDS Control Programme (NACP), launched in 1992, is being implemented as a comprehensive programme for prevention and control of HIV/AIDS in India. National AIDS Control Board (NACB) was constituted and an autonomous National AIDS Control Organization (NACO) was set up to implement the project Migrants bear a heightened risk of HIV infection, which results from the condition and structure of the migration process. Available evidence suggests that migration could be fuelling the spread of HIV epidemic in high out migration states such as Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Rajasthan, Orissa, Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat.

BSST performed TI Project Training on HIV & AIDS in Ahmadabad for male sex workers as well as female sex workers for promoting component preparation and availability along with rational use of blood in health care facilities and building capacity of health care providers to achieve this objective.







NACP – IV (CORE GROUP)

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – GUJARAT STATE AIDS CONTROL SOCITY, AHMADABAD

The strategies under NACP IV include:

- Providing comprehensive HIV care and support through need based package of services
- **Up-scaling access to Anti-Retroviral Treatment for all eligible PLHIV including children**
- Strengthening systems for management of opportunistic infections
- Addressing stigma and discrimination issues in health care settings
- Strengthening systems for quality assurance, monitoring and evaluation of services to ensure continued high level of drug adherence and retention in care
- **Building capacities and integrate with health system,**

Facilitating access to support services i.e. psycho-social and nutritional support through linkages with key departments and ministries.

BSST performed TI Project Training on HIV & AIDS in Mehshana for male sex workers as well as female sex workers.







SABLA

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – COMMISSIONAR, WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT GANDHINAGAR

Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls - SABLA - would be implemented using the platform of ICDS Scheme through Anganwadi Centres (AWCs).

The objectives of the Scheme are to

- i. Enable the AGs for self-development and empowerment
- ii. Improve their nutrition and health status.
- iii. Promote awareness about health, hygiene, nutrition, Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health (ARSH) and family and child care.
- iv. Upgrade their home-based skills, life skills and tie up with National Skill Development Program (NSDP) for vocational skills
- v. Mainstream out of school AGs into formal/non formal education
- vi. Provide information/guidance about existing public services such as PHC, CHC, Post Office, Bank, Police Station, etc







BSST works towards the vision to adolescent girl in various fields between 11 to 18 years of age in Banaskantha by providing training such as Candle & Agarbati making, Achar Papad, Bank Account opening, and General Social guidance under proper guidance which make them more independent.



RURAL MART

NAME OF DEPARTMENT - NABARD

The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) is extending financial help to women Self-Help Groups (SHGs) to set up a rural mart, a first of its kind in the district, to provide a direct market-link for the products manufactured by them.

The rural mart will be functioning as a common sales outlet/store to promote and market the domestic products of those SHG members who were given specific training on skill development and economic activities under various NABARD-sponsored programmes.

"Rural mart" has been the new success story for villagers here in providing market-link for domestic products manufactured by rural community, particularly by women and weaker sections.





"Rural mart" has been the new success story for villagers here in providing market-link for domestic products manufactured by rural community, particularly by women and weaker sections.Products marketed under catchy and common brand endowed with brand equity to household commodities supplied from different places have been widely appreciated in urban area here.

Fascination for unadulterated foodstuffs besides genuine homemade articles has added another dimension to the "Rural Mart". The store promotes eatables like *papad*, *bari*, *sattu*, *chura* (flattened rice), katarni rice, besides incense sticks, hand-woven silk, cotton fabrics, khadi materials and local handicrafts items.

The aim behind opening the mart is to provide a market for domestic items at competitive rates to rural people engaged in producing such products. The endeavor is also to provide unadulterated eatables and genuine products at reasonable rate to consumers living in urban areas.



The rural mart will be functioning as a com.mon sales outlet / store to promote and market the domestic products for those members who were given specific training on skill development and economic activities under various programmed.

Rural Mart program was performed by BSST in Patan supported by NABARD for Local Artisans of Handicraft Rural Mart Activity & Fair in near railway Station, Bus Stop, Airport area in Patan District for Foreign Tourists to provide a direct market – link for the products manufactured by them.





VOCATIONAL TRAINING

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – MAHILA ARTHIK VIKASH NIGAM

On behalf of the Government of Maharashtra, the Mahila Arthik Vikas Mahamandal (MAVIM) has taken up the cause of overall development of women – half the part of our society.

MAVIM has taken tireless efforts for over a decade to initiate, expand and establish the self-help group movement in Maharashtra. The progressive Government of Maharashtra has always supported the cause of women's empowerment and has form time to time devised supportive policy mechanisms and assure them that even in the future the Government will continue to support them.

So with all these efforts by government BSST has also performed activities of vocational training for women in Mehshana, Gujarat such as Stitching & dress making Training.





ASHA TRAINING MODULE

NAME OF DEPARTMENT- NHM DAMAN

One of the key components of the mission is creating a band of female health volunteers, appropriately named "Accredited Social Health Activist" (ASHA) in each village within the identified States. These ASHAs would act as a 'bridge' between the rural people and health service outlets and would play a central role, in achieving national health and population policy goals. ASHA's are to be selected by community, out of residents within the community.

ASHA's needs to be organized closer to communities. A major challenge will be to sustain the interest of selected women participating in the initial training programme. BSST has been working. ASHA program for link workers in Daman, DIV to provide training to Link workers on Awareness on HIV AIDS.







DRINKING WATER

NAME OF DEPARTMENT - FLAD DRUG

Large volumes of pharmaceuticals and their metabolites, mostly from human waste flushed down the toilet, are exiting municipal waste water treatment plants intact and, by some estimates, <u>contaminating almost 25%</u> of the world's rivers and lakes. About 10,000 drugs are on the market in Western countries. Many have been detected in the environment in concentrations ranging from nanograms to micrograms per liter. All are biologically active by design; many are bioaccumulative and persistent.

No one, especially a teenager, likes to be lectured to about what he or she can or cannot do. Thus, BSST provide the facts that allow a person to make an informed decision on their own to remain drug-free. The key to the success of this educational program is student participation. To that end, youth of Patan District are invited to join activities that promote drug-free living—activities proven popular and which can involve students and community members of all ages.

BSST performed awareness among youths to suggest that public health can be improved by changing the environment.





URBAN SANITATION

People in the urban households do not have access to toilets and defecate in the open. Weak sanitation has significant health costs and untreated sewage from cities is the single biggest source of water resource pollution in India. This indicates both the scale of the challenge ahead of the Indian cities and the huge costs incurred from not addressing them. BSST has launched the Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan Mission in rural areas for the people for ensuring hygiene, waste management and sanitation across the nation.

BSST main objective is to bring about an improvement in the general quality of life in the rural areas, by promoting cleanliness, hygiene and eliminating open defecation. So we have implemented sanitation activity in the Junagadh, Rajasthan, Surat, Vadodara and in the following districts of Gujarat which is mention below:

SAFETY AND HEALTH TRAINING PROGRAMME

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – BUILDING AND OTHERS CONSTRUCTION WORKER'S WALFARE BOARD

India's complex social system with layers of hierarchy result in health issues becoming a critical concern in development of all adults from marginalized communities. Discrimination and exclusion by service providers results in half of Dalit children being malnourished, and one third of Dalit adult population being underweight. Through various health programmes, BSST addresses the root cause of health inequities in the country, and works towards ensuring improved access to health and well-being for marginalized communities. We work on strengthening government's healthcare delivery systems that enable fulfillment of rights and entitlements related to health for men, women and all age people. Through various on ground initiatives like training healthcare workers, and building capacity of community representatives, we are working towards bringing a sustainable change in the country's healthcare delivery system.



BSST held its activity for construction worker train on health & Safety for construction workers in Patan, Morbi, Porbandar where we covered 21 villages including Panch Mahal, Mahisagar, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Banaskantha, Kheda & Dahod under Gandhinagar and covered around 70 villages






WIDOW TRAINING

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – COMMISSIONER WOMEN & CHILD DEVELOPMENT, GANDHINAGAR

Strengthening of women's has turning into a consuming issue everywhere throughout the world including India since most recent couple of decades. Women need to have for themselves similar procedures of progress which men folk have had throughout the hundreds of years, for example, parallel pay for meet work.



BSST performed activities for widow training age between 18-40 years in different districts such as Banaskantha, Sabarkantha, Mehshana, Patan, Sabarkantha, Gir Somnath, Narmada and Arvali.





SWADHAR GRUH

NAME OF DEPARTMENT – COMMISSIONER WOMEN AND CHILD DEPARTMENT, GANDHINAGAR

Recognizing the need to prevent women from exploitation and to support their survival and rehabilitation, the scheme of Short Stay Home for women and girls was introduced as a social defense mechanism, by the then Department of Social Welfare in 1969. The scheme is meant to provide temporary accommodation, maintenance and rehabilitative services to women and girls rendered homeless due to family discord, crime, violence, mental stress, social ostracism or are being forced into prostitution and are in moral danger. Another scheme with the similar objectives namely Swadhar –A Scheme for Women in Difficult Circumstances was launched by the Department of Women and Child Development in 2001- 02. The scheme through the provisions of shelter, food, clothing, counseling, training, clinical and legal aid aims to rehabilitate such women in difficult circumstance.








JAL DOOT PROGRAM

NAME OF DEPARTMENT - NABARD

BSST launched a major Water Campaign to cover around (HOWMANY) villages in vulnerable/water stressed areas where the ground water is over exploited. Major highlights of the campaign include community participation in adopting efficient irrigation methods, ground water recharge and appropriate crop pattern for enhancing agricultural productivity. Our main concern is exploitation of ground water, so provide information to farmers to recharge the ground water table by constructing water harvesting structures. So, we would identify Village Volunteers to run the campaign for a localized and more effective approach. These volunteers will increase awareness about various methods of rain water harvesting, efficient water use, groundwater recharge and integrated farming systems.







NURSING COLLEGE VISIT

BSST that focuses on building leadership skills through activities and events. Getting involved will help students reach their own personal potential and improve their student experience. Resume building and career development opportunities are also available.







SWEET DISTRIBUTION

BSST organized a program of sweet distribution for those people in rural areas who cannot bear with those facilities on the occasion of Diwali festival and to make them feel special in the society.












