



## **ADIP Scheme**

Assistance to Disabled persons for purchasing/fitting of aids/appliances (ADIP) scheme is to assist the needy disabled persons in procuring durable, sophisticated and scientifically manufactured, modern, standard aids and appliances that can promote their physical, social and psychological rehabilitation, by reducing the effects of disabilities and enhance their economic potential.

After implementing the ADIP scheme for three consecutive years the organization had got exposure to the procedure that needs to be followed for implementing the program. Hence, BSST has tried to keep all the necessary government departments in the loop to reach out to a maximum number of beneficiaries and benefit them from the scheme.

BSST have assisted more than 350 disabled persons in the financial year under the ADIP schemes. The kind of assistance provided to the people and list of beneficiaries are updated on our website. For more detail Click Here.

# **HIV Programme**

It is critical to engage people to enhance understanding regarding the unmet needs of the population who are infected by HIV/AIDS. The main objective of BSST is toreduce new infections, comprehensive care, support & treatment to all people living with HIV/AIDS (PLHIV).

The effort is funded by **Gujarat state AIDS control society**, Ahmedabad and focuses on reducing stigma and discrimination attached with HIV infectedpeople. The Project is implemented in Mehsana and Ahmedabad districts by BSST.

BSST carried out various activities which benefited people 5000 in Ahmedabad &6800 people Major Mehsana. in activities included the World AIDS Day celebration which offered



the key opportunity to increase the awareness among people, mostpossibleaccess to the treatment as well as discussing the preventive measures, Prophylactic sheath (Condom) and ART medicine distribution, providing information to canopy, HIV testing and support, CBS testing, convergence of various governmental schemes and handhold support, development of condom depots, serving by BSST's doctor, etc. Apart from Worlds Aids Day celebration campaigns were also held for interpersonal behaviour change communication (BCC), Promotion/ distributions of condoms, Provision of services for Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs), Linkages to Integrated Counseling and Testing Services (ICTC), Advocacy for Enabling Environment.

This positive impact of the programme has reduced new infections, comprehensive care, support and treatment to all people living with HIV/AIDS.

# **LWS Programme**

Under the HIV programme, BSST runs the Link Worker Scheme- LWS for the migrants' people as migrants are at very high-risk HIV infection. BSST run the LWS programme in **100 villages** of Mehsana District. Objectives of the LWS scheme are:

- To increase the use and availability of condoms in risky behaviour groups as well
  - as men and women who are more likely to get HIV.
- To do liaisoning for referral and follow up with various services (such as TB Diagnosis



and Treatment, ICTC / PPTCT, ART as well as Care and Support Center).

- Creating a conducive environment for HIV infected people and their families to reduce discrimination and stigma against those living with HIV in community structures or groups (village health committees, self-help groups and panchayats).
- Reaching out to risky groups as well as HIV-positive women and men in rural areas with information, knowledge and skills to reduce the risk of HIV / STIs.

# **TI Project- Mehsana**

The Targeted Intervention (TI) programme is the flagship prevention initiative of the National AIDS Control Organisation (NACO) for HIV and AIDS prevention. BSST's major focus is FWS and MSM, TG who are the most vulnerable from the STD and HIV related diseases.

Core Elements of the Targeted Intervention:

- Community Outreach
- Service Delivery
- Commodity Distribution
- Community System Strengthening



BSST work on the TI project since 2012 with the awareness of HIV infection and facilitate the HIV infected people. Till March 2020 BSST has a reach of 518 FWS and 727 MSM. Below data show the beneficiaries and highlight of work under the TI project progress in the financial year 2019-20.

# SwadharGruh Yojana

Violence against women is a violation of the rights of women enshrined in the Constitution of India. Inequality prevails between women and men in almost all spheres of society. Violence and inequality against women are widespread as social and family structures in society are patriarchal. Violence against women causes women to become victims of violence in society due to their standard of living, development, property rights, economic development, decision making, etc. For the overall upliftment of such victimized and exploited women as well as for the woman to live with dignity and become self-reliant, aware of their rights as well as the legal shields they face and not have to wander to different places for justice and get all kinds of help in one place. The Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India has implemented "Swadhar Griha" scheme in eight districts of the state.





As of now, SwadharGruh Project is being implemented in the 8 different districts of Gujarat like Bhavanagar, Ahemdabad, Vadodara, Dahod, Anand, Surendranagar, Gandhinagar, and Patan.

BSST is implementing the scheme 'SwadharGruh' in the district of Patan. The benefit of this scheme is available to all the women who are victims of violence in the district. Victim women from other districts are also covered when the need arises. At present, the "SwadharGruh" of Patan district has started at Rajkavado Old Beheramunga School Patan, G. Patan.

#### **BSST Ensure**

- Women victims of violence in private and public places can get all kinds of help in one place.
- A woman affected by violence can get help round the clock.
- Ensure that women victims of violence receive immediate and long-term services such as **medical**, **legal**, **psychological counselling**, **and police assistance** to resolve violence.
- We ensure that the woman who is a victim of violence gets free shelter for three years.

In the year 7 people are getting the benefit from the scheme and they are gettingthe necessary support from the organisation.

# Sakhi One Stop Centre

Gender-Based Violence (GBV) is global health, human rights and development issue that transcends geography, class, culture, age, race and religion to affect every community and country in every corner of the world. The Article 1 of UN Declaration on the Elimination of Violence 1993 defines gender-based abuse, calling it "any act of gender-based violence that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual or psychological harm or suffering to women, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or in private life".

In India, gender-based violence has many manifestations; from the more universally prevalent forms of domestic and sexual violence including rape to harmful practices such as dowry, honour killings, acid attacks, witch - hunting, sexual harassment, child sexual abuse, trafficking for commercial sexual exploitation, child marriage, sex-selective abortion, sati etc.

Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD), has formulated a Centrally



Sponsored Scheme for setting up One Stop Centre, a sub-scheme of Umbrella Scheme for National Mission Empowerment of women including MattritavSahyaog Indira Gandhi Yojana. Popularly known Sakhi, as the scheme is being implemented since 1<sup>st</sup> April 2015. These Centres are being

established across the country to provide integrated support and assistance under one roof to women affected by violence, both in private and public spaces in a phased manner.

One-Stop Centres (OSC) are intended to support women affected by violence, in private and public spaces, within the family, community and at workplace. Women facing physical, sexual, emotional, psychological and economic abuse, irrespective of age, class, caste, education status, marital status, race and culture will



facilitated with support and redressal. Aggrieved women facing any kind of violence due to attempted sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence, trafficking, honour-related crimes, acid attacks or witch-hunting who have reached out or been referred to the OSC will be provided with specialized services.

The objectives of the Scheme are:


- To provide integrated support and assistance to women affected by violence, both in private and public spaces under one roof.
- To facilitate immediate, emergency and non emergency access to a range of services including medical, legal, psychological and counselling support under one roof to fight against any forms of violence against women.

BSST provides different facilities as per the objectives of the programme to the victim of different kind of violence which focuses on the reduction in the societal crimes. We also provides the residential support to the victims.


BSST run the Sakhi One-Stop centre in the three district of Gujarat- Patan, Dahod and Bharuch. Here is the glimpse of our work:

# **Apparel Training Centre**

The textile sector provides second-highest employment in India. It contributes to 4 percent of GDP and 18 % of employment in the industrial sector. While keeping in mind, BSST runs the Maitry Apparel Training centre in Patan district in which BSST provides the five different training with the support of Government of Gujarat and District Industrial Centre- DIC. BSST has provided training to 200women in the year 2018-19.

# **Participatory Irrigation Management**

Participatory Irrigation Management works for irrigational benefits like decrease in use of ground water, helps reducing water expense, reduce time spent on irrigation thereby resulting in net profit. PIM is a reform programworking for the benefit of larger group of farmers collectively through sharing of water for irrigation.

BSST provides training and technical support after which outcome of training is

monitored. In this a total of 1200 farmers got benefitted. Farmers are made responsible for adequate maintenance of irrigation system and economic utilisation of water for agricultural usage. PIM is funded Sardar Sarovar by Narmada Nigam Ltd. Gandhinagar.



There is decrease in production cost of crops due to easy availability of water. The PIM project has been initiated and implemented in Patan district of Gujarat which is an arid region and normally receives much less rain compared to other districts of Gujarat.

# **National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction (NAPDDR)**

Article 47 of the Constitution provides that "The State shall regard the raising of the level of nutrition and the standard of living of its people and the improvement of public health as among its primary duties and, in particular, the State shall

endeavour to bring about prohibition of the consumption except for medicinal purposes of intoxicating drinks and of drugs which are injurious to health."

Drug and substance abuse is a serious problem adversely affecting the social fabric of the country. Addiction to drugs not only affects the individual's health but also disrupts their families and the whole society. Of late, the menace of drug abuse in the younger generation has been rising all over the world and India is no exception to it. The Ministry has prepared a National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction for 2018-2023 to focus on preventive education, awareness generation, identification, counselling, treatment and rehabilitation of drug-dependent persons and training and capacity building of the service providers through collaborative efforts of the Central and State Governments and Non-Governmental Organizations.

BSST has work as a mother NGO in Gujarat to provide training on Capacity building and Awareness generation programme on Drug demand reduction.





During the year 2019-20, BSST has conducted numbers of seminars, camps, meetings at schools, colleges and community level in the 249 blocks of Gujarat state. During the year, more than 240 camps were held and spread awareness programmes, sharing words on education importance, drugs dependent persons

were identified and counselling was done. About 1.25 lac of people/students/community members got benefited from the awareness programme and counselling.

#### **NABARD-LEDP**

As skill up-gradation training alone has limited impact on livelihood creation among the SHG members, it was thought prudent to create sustainable livelihoods among SHG members and to attain optimum benefit out of skill upgradation and a new scheme titled Livelihood and Enterprise Development Programme (LEDP).

The objective of the program is to create the sustainable livelihood amongst Self Help Group (SHG) members, by giving them, valuable training on major

livelihood activities and to set-up a demonstration plot there by one of the active artisans and adding value on their products too. During the project period, the program covered 90 members from multiple SHG combing both the project district.

Training, Capacity Building, Exposure visit, Market Linkage facility, Business

expansion kind of activities were carried out with the SHG participants. The activities were carried out on Hand Embroidery and Patch Work have done for creating sustainable livelihoods amongst 90 SHGs members from the 18 SHGs of 4 villages of Patan Districts.



LEDP project is in progress will be continued in the year 2020-21. Due to COVID-19 pandemic project work was on hold.

# **ASHA Worker Training**

Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) is a trained female community health activist selected from the community itself and accountable to it, the ASHA workers were trained by BSST to work as an interface between the community and the public health system.

BSST has provided the training on module 6 and 7 and to refresher from June 2019to March 2020 freshers as well as working ASHA workers during the year



2019-20. BSST has provided a training to 5000 ASHA workers in the various districts of Gujarat.

# **Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS)**

The Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) is a centrally sponsored scheme aimed at building a protective environment for children in difficult circumstances, as well as other vulnerable children, through Government-Civil Society Partnership.

Under the scheme, BSST has provided the training to the people related to child care society. We have provided training on different subjects as child labour, child marriage, beggaring activities, child trafficking, child sex abuse, mental torture, online torture etc. in 28 different batches. The training was provided in Gujarat state.



About 1900 people got trained and benefited from the schemes. Apart from the training we have provided the training on rolls and responsibilities of members of child welfare committee and juvenile justice board.

# **Help Desk Centre**

A Help Desk Centre is a resource intended to provide the end user with information of various governmental schemes and support related work to a governmental schemes and services. Help Desk Centre is intending to strengthen the utilization of Government schemes and services by facilitating the process of application to the various schemes and creating awareness about the existing schemes programs. It is envisaged that ensuring overage under the Government safety net programs will ensure attainment of the sustainable development goals. The project interventions are designed to be applied in settings with poor utilization of existing Government schemes by effectively addressing the bottle necks that impedes the utilization of health and nutrition services and mars the improvement in health indicators. The integrated approach entails the following:

- 1. Establishing Help Desk Center within the reach of the communities
- 2. Strengthening of public service delivery system

- 3. Improve utilization of the Government's health and nutrition programs
- 4. Awareness generation
- 5. Liaising & Coordination with key Government stakeholders

The main objective of Help Desk Centre is to strengthen the existing Government schemes by ensuring 100% utilization of Government safety net programs& schemes.

BSST has established 6 Help Desk Centre in Patan District in which four are in Santalpur block and two are in Patan. The functioning of Help Desk Centre will take place sooner.


